Firewood Permit Information

Firewood permit sales are now available through *jblm.isportsman.net*. Those seeking firewood must make an account, complete the validation process, and purchase a permit through their account prior to cutting. Costs have not changed. In-person sales are no longer available at the Forest Resource Office on Plant Rd.

Detailed information on how to create an account, purchase a permit, check in/out of areas, and more is available in the Frequently Asked Questions document featured on the prelogin homepage of *jblm.isportsman.net*.

JBLM firewood is primarily decked logging debris. Log-deck availability can be found at the bottom of the Open Areas page of the website (https://jblm.isportsman.net/areas.aspx), and decks are separated by full price (Log Deck: Plant Road) and cleanup (Log Deck: Plant Road Cleanup). Cutters must check-in to an open deck prior to cutting, and check-in capacity for each deck is limited to three (3). Check-out is therefore very important to give others a chance to collect.

The following rules apply:

- 1. **Firewood is for personal use only and cannot be resold.** Commercial firewood dealers may call (253) 964-2100 for information on sealed-bid deck sales.
- 2. Firewood permits are available to all, but it is up to each individual to ensure they can get through JBLM gates. Log decks are located within the cantonment area and an iSportsman permit does not confer gate access.
- 3. Permits are valid for two days after purchase, and cutting is available Monday Sunday. Cutting hours are from sunrise-sunset year-round.
- 4. **Cutters are limited to one (1) cord per day**. Trucks/trailers exceeding this limit cannot be filled. Please be courteous of others.
 - a. Only empty vehicles are allowed in cutting areas. Any wood already in a vehicle is assumed to be taken under the current permit.
- 5. Cutting from anywhere other than a marked log deck is prohibited. Blown down trees, single logs, or miscellaneous fuelwood away from approved decks must remain on the ground for habitat. No standing trees, dead or alive, may be cut.
- 6. Cleanup areas are where only scraps (small pieces and/or large chunks, butt ends, etc..) or lower quality material remain from full-price areas.
- 7. Because firewood availability can change quickly, cutters are strongly encouraged to drive by decks and check the Open Areas page regularly to confirm availability before purchasing a permit. Refunds are not available through the iSportsman system.
- 8. Half cord = 2'x4'x8' (64ft³); Full cord = 4'x4'x8' (128ft³)
